
Floor Plan

# **Design Proposal**


In the garden that we are supposed to design, our aim and goal is to design a garden that is relaxing and joyful for people who live in the building



Our theme is basically the combination of Persian gardens, containing long ponds with the Indian outdoor Gazebo



Basically, the pond is located in the center of the garden, having an open pond with fish inside. At the two sides of the open pond, people will be able to walk over an enclosed pond. This closed pond has glass on top where people can walk and look down at the fish. There will also be small, continuous channels of the pond surrounding the long centered pond. Beside this channel there are benches and chairs for people to sit on to enjoy the view of the fish inside the water. The channels will also be covered with glass, so it would be safer for people to walk around without having to watch where they step every while

The idea of the magazine collecting paintings from the entire world inspired me to do a small workshop that looks like an exhibition.



# Design Proposal




In this project, we were supposed to research an artist, to find out how and what kind of environment does this artist need as a studio space. Each student was supposed to create and design an art space for a specific young artist if her choice. The artist that we have chosen is Abdulrahman Zainal Ibrahim Al Awadhi, the .first abstract Emirati artist in the UAE

Because is an artist that is very much attached to his culture and traditional values as an Emirati, we decided that the space of the art studio will look like the old, traditional houses that are located now in Al Bastakiya. Basically, our concept is that the art studio and gallery is located inside an old traditional house, having a large courtyard and open sections and spaces at the edges of the house

The courtyard in the middle of the house will be used as an art space for the artist to show his work. It will be used as a garden that the artist himself has created in the shape of the UAE map

In the opened sections around the garden, the artist will display different art works depending on the sections of his choice

There will be five different sections in the ground floor; the sea section, the desert section, the mountain section, traditional section, and the abstract section. An arc in the walls that are dividing them opens all of these sections to each other. Also, each section will have visual and sound effects that relate to the specified section. For example, the sea section will contain waves sounds to make the viewers feel the mood of the sea. Moreover, there will be sand and wind sounds in the desert and mountains sections too
